Time to write an **introductory paragraph**. The introductory paragraph lets your readers know what to expect. It introduces them to your ideas. Start with stating the topic. Add the three main ideas that support that topic and a concluding sentence, and you're on your way!

1. Introductory Paragraph



Topic Sentence (for example, "Winter is a wonderful season."):

In the next sentence(s) tell the reader your three favorite things.
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Conclude the paragraph with a statement that encourages the reader to read more (for example, "Certainly, with all of these special things to enjoy, why wouldn't anybody love winter?").

Body Paragraphs

Now let's take each of your favorite things and turn them into the body paragraphs of your essay. Start by restating the idea in a topic sentence. Next, add three detail sentences. End with a concluding sentence that sums up the main idea of the paragraph.

Example:



(Topic Sentence) Sledding is a fun activity that can only be enjoyed in winter. (Detail Sentence) Find the steepest hill you can and push off in your sled! (Detail Sentence) The cold wind rushing past your face will make you feel like you are flying. (Detail Sentence) You and your friends will be shouting and laughing in excitement when you suddenly reach the bottom of the hill. (Concluding Sentence) Without a doubt, you will be running back up the hill as fast as you can for another run on your sled!

Notice that the concluding sentence begins with the phrase "Without a doubt". This is called a **transitional phrase**. Transitional words and phrases help your paragraphs to flow and sound polished. A sample list of transitional words and phrases appears at the top of the next page. Try to use one of these at the beginning of each concluding sentence you write.


